# **BOSS Quarterly Reporting**













#### What Does the Data Represent?

- Program capability, which implies performance, as measured against Army-wide standards.
- Translation:
  - Have the necessary resources (staff and equipment) been provided to enable the BOSS program?
  - Have the staff completed requisite training to ensure effective delivery of the BOSS program?
  - Is your BOSS program fulfilling the three pillars (Quality of Life, Community Service, and Recreation & Leisure)?



#### Why is it Important?

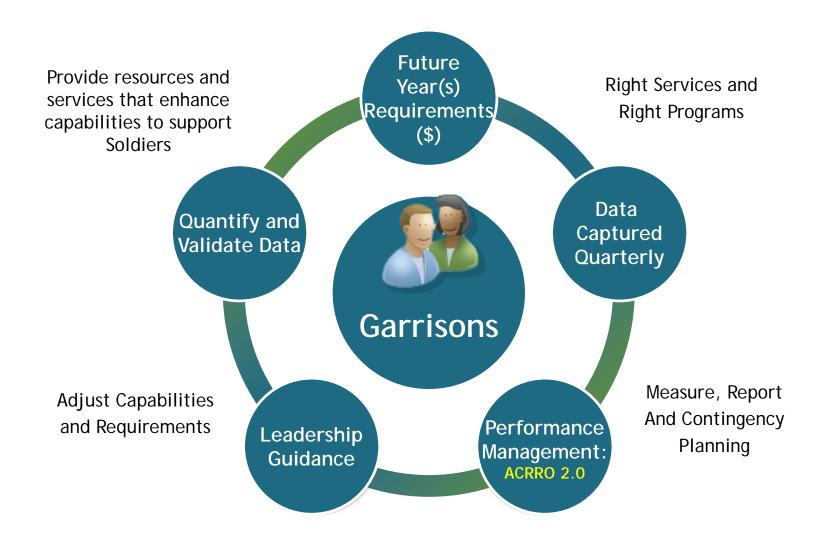
During FY10, the BOSS Program was "upgraded" from a CAT B program to a CAT A (mission essential) program.

#### Translation:

- FMWR CAT A programs are authorized a minimum of 85% appropriated fund (APF) support.
- BOSS, however, gained the CAT A designation without the corresponding APF support (\$\$).
- IMCOM G9 HQ BOSS actively campaigns for dedicated APF support based on requirements as identified in Garrison quarterly reports



#### The Process





#### Who Reviews the Quarterly Reports?

- Garrison Program Staff, to include BOSS
- Garrison Program Managers
- Garrison Community Recreation Directors
- Garrison Directors of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation
- Region Managers
- IMCOM G9 Headquarters Staff



#### Where Does the Quarterly Data Go?

- IMCOM G9 HQ analyzes the quarterly performance data to identify strengths and weaknesses in the BOSS program.
  - Determine adequate support from Garrison Command
  - Validate requirements
  - Provides justification to argue for funding
  - Provides decision points for multiple levels of command

### When do you Report?

Ready!

Enter Information! Each quarter, enter/validate program data.

Go!

Notify the Program Manager that Data is Complete! Complete data entry/review data and have the Program Manager review the data before the quarter closes.

Garrisons Enter Q2 Data June

Garrisons Enter Q3 Data September

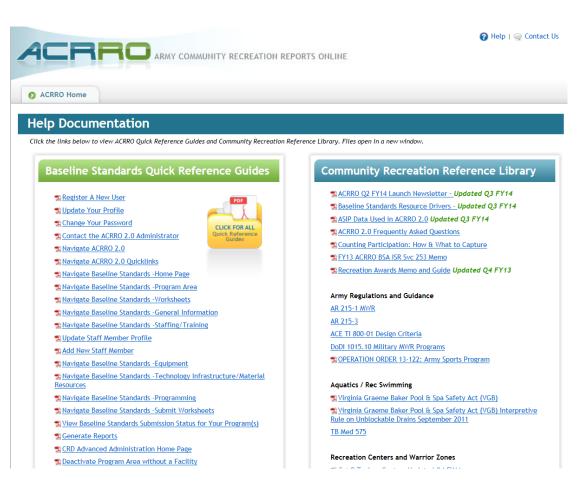

<sup>\*</sup>ALL Standards & Scores for Aquatics & Recreation Swimming Program Areas are calculated by splitting resources based on # of hours of programming for Aquatics (CAT A) & Recreation Swimming (CAT B). The total authorized resources for a pool will always be the sum of Aquatics & Recreation Swimming.



#### The Basics: Black, Red, Amber, Green

The Army's readiness rating system is commonly associated with the BRAG scheme (Black, Red, Amber, Green). Program elements are measured to ensure efficient, effective performance relative to allocated resources.

It is critical to report accurate data that provides valuable insight into the "pain points" that need additional support.

Color Ratings					
Color	Rating Description				
Green:	Supports current mission without work-arounds (adjustments that can increase time and/or cost)				
Amber:	Minimal or moderate work-arounds (adjustments that can increase time and/or cost) required to accomplish mission				
Red:	Cannot fully support current mission, or may require significant work-arounds (adjustments that can increase time and/or cost) to accomplish mission				
Black	Cannot support mission
