#### **BOSS Life Skills: Nutrition and Crock Pot Cooking Class**





On 20 April 2016 at Hawana's, 19 single soldiers participated in a three hour hands on course that covered basic nutrition, healthy food selection, kitchen knife skills and safe food handling concepts under the umbrella of a Crock Pot Cooking Class. In addition to the valuable life skills listed above, the 19 soldiers left with a Crock Pot of their own free of charge that they can use in their barracks to put their new skills in practice.

The first hour of the course was led by Dr. Bret Kugler of Kadena Health Promotions. Dr. Kugler covered basic nutrition concepts as well as making healthy choices at the grocery store and while dining out. SGT Wallace from 10thRSG led the second hour of the course by showing the soldiers safe food handling and kitchen knife techniques. SGT Wallace also demonstrated a sample recipe in the Crock Pot and the students used the third hour to practice their new kitchen skills.

This event was the first utilizing a new IMCOM funding stream for 'Life Skills' for single soldiers via BOSS. The next BOSS Life Skills events will be SCUBA certification courses during the months of May and June.

OVERVIEW: FT Hood BOSS partnered with the FMWR Aquatics as part of the BOSS Life Skills program for Single Soldiers. This program was designed to instruct and certify Single Soldiers in CPR//AED Life skills. BOSS coordinated this life skills event to assist and educate Single Soldiers to understand Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and the use of the Automated external defibrillator (AED), which is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnosis the life threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and ventricular tachycardia in a patient The instructors also went over basic life saving steps, both for adults and children. Soldiers were tested and than certified with a two year certification card after completion of the Life skills event. This was a very interactive event that had the Soldiers thinking and

#### OVERVIEV

<u>Procram Description</u>: This program is mandatory for new and current BOSS reps and Soldiers who chaperone BOSS tours and events. Additionally, this training will be useful to Soldiers who find themselves in a situation, on or off duty, where they may be called upon to assist in an emergency situation. This is a lifesaving skill that everyone should learn to be able to assist in life and death situations.

<u>Goals</u>: Our goal is to ensure that all BOSS council members and other interested Soldiers are afforded the opportunity to learn the lifesaving skills of First Aid, CPR and AED training.

<u>Obiectives</u>: Provide First Aid training to all BOSS Council members and other Soldiers on a "no cost basis".

This program allowed Area 1 BOSS council and additional BOSS Reps an opportunity to attend this CPR training class at no cost to the participants. This class allowed 20 participants to attend the training in Area 1. During the training food and beverages were offered to the participants. All participants were delighted about the training and filled out BOSS activity surveys. The total cost of the Life Skills training was \$1,309.90. This training will be conducted again in early January 2017.
